Some new results :

- Teens are more likely to participate in sports if parents are supportive, but not controlling.
- Living in rural neighbourhoods (vs urban) is linked to greater maintenance of sport participation.
- As feelings of competence, autonomy, and relatedness in sports increase, so does participation.

- As nonprofit organizations, sport clubs experience freedom (rather than pressure) to engage in multiple causes.
- Our study found a balance between altruistic and strategic motives related to their social responsibility initiatives; although most clubs had desire for stronger link with club priorities and mission.
